Projects: Over the last 12 months, we have worked on a wide range of projects. These are just some of those:

- 1 Frondeg, a new sheltered housing development for over 2 55's older person apartments in Pwllheli was handed over in November 2023. The 28 new homes for Adra are located on a tight urban site designed in keeping with the scale and mass of the former school building.
- 3 The Warren Drive scheme in Thornton-Cleveleys is completed in Spring 2023 for Lovell Partnership. The development offers 86 new homes, including affordable units and Help to buy options in the new community.
- 5 Gladstone Library, a Grade I listed building in Hawarden requires essential works. A listed building application was submitted in Dec 2023. Works include repairs and remediation to the slate roof and front entrance porch.
- 7 Works were completed in Autumn 2023 for the refurbishment and internal reordering of Castleway Primary School in Leasowe, Wirral. Spaces were reconfigured to accommodate a nursery and additional pupil numbers in classrooms.
- 9 Dec 2023: Planning Approval granted to convert listed Rydal School to 34 apartments and 34 family houses in Colwyn Bay for Castlegreen Homes included Heritage Statement and production of site wide CGI 3D visuals.

- 2 Frampton Road in Gorseinon, a new specialist housing in South Wales, is handed over in June 2023 for First Choice Housing. The semi-independent living village provides 4 bungalows and a shared home for 4 adults with care team, offices and communal facilities.
- 4 Completed in Autumn '23, 58 Hope Street involved the restoration of a Grade II listed building in Wrexham City Centre's Conservation Area, as part of the THI works. This involved restoring the Victorian shop front and converting upper floors into residential spaces.
- 6 In September 2023 planning approval was gained for Carr Lane East, a new residential scheme on brownfield land in Croxteth, on behalf of Cobalt Housing.
- 8 Maes Bleddyn, Rachub near Bethesda for Adra was handed over in October 2023. The family housing scheme is one of 4 low energy projects forming the North Wales collaboration for the Innovative Housing Programme (IHP4) funded by Welsh Government.
- 10 The Laureates in Cockermouth was completed this year on behalf of Lovell Partnership. The scheme provided 213 new homes of a number of phases, with AGa helping to design 18 new housetypes for the site.
